Pastoral Message

Abide with me: fast falls the eventide; The darkness deepens; Lord, with me abide: When other helpers fail, and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, O abide with me.

I grew up singing this first stanza of this hymn to conclude our evening family prayers. We continue to do that even today. However, during my college days

when I moved to a different part of the country, I only heard it sung during the funerals. Interestingly Henry Francis Lyte wrote this great and famous hymn just before his death in 1847. I would like to share with you some parts of the story told by Amos R. Wells in his book, "A Treasury of Hymn Stories."

Henry Francis Lyte was born June 1, 1793 in Scotland. He was early left an orphan, and in comparative poverty. Three times in college his poems won him prizes. He became a clergyman of the Church of England. When Lyte was sick, he was visited by a young clergyman to provide him spiritual comfort. To their mutual grief, they found themselves groping for the light, veritable blind guides. Their search led them into confident certainty, and Lyte emerged from that sick room a changed man. Lyte continued to experience challenges with his health. On the fourth of September 1847, for the last time he was on the pulpit. He said, "I stand here among you today as alive from the dead, if I may hope to impress it upon you, and induce you to prepare for that solemn hour which much come to all, by a timely acquaintance with the death of Christ." That evening he wrote his last and greatest hymn: Abide with me. This hymn handed to a member of his family that very night. He died on November 20 same year. His last words being, "Joy! Peace!" Thus "Abide with me" was written in the shadows of death. Moreover, Lyte had been having some trouble with his people, and it is said that the words, "when other helpers fail," were prompted by the estrangement of some of his helpers in the church.

Pastoral Message (continued)

At one time or the other, we all feel helpless in our lives. Feeling helpless is normal. When we feel helpless, we want our friends and family around us. Not that anyone can fix the feeling of being helpless, but somehow, we find comfort knowing that they are present. Of course, there are also those who cause more stress by trying to help in unhelpful ways; we want to keep them out.

Lyte's prayer to God was simply to ask God to be with him. As a person of faith, he knew God was already with him. So why was he struggling so much? His struggle was not so much death itself, rather, going through the sickness. In his last days, he was also struggling with relationships, some might have been unresolved.

Sickness could isolate people. Going through any kind of sickness or even life's struggles and challenges could be long and lonely journeys. Those are the times we need the help of God more than any other time in our lives. We not only need God but also need one another to become the channels of the presence of God to one another. God doesn't fix our problems. Rather God journeys with us in our struggles so that we don't need to be alone. "Abide with me, O help of the helpless, Abide with me". Amen.

We had small group sessions that provided an exercise in hearing others and their concerns and truly listening instead of turning inward and focusing on my own needs while they are sharing their views and concerns. Dee went ahead with planning a way for the ministry to begin. Mary and committed to making shawls that would be blessed on all Fifth Sundays. So, it was decided that all fifth Sundays in the year would be Prayer Shawl Blessing Sundays. They have made, prayed over, brought to church for a congregational blessings, and distributed over 20 shawls (some recent ones are pictured below).

Cookbook Corner

Baked Pineapple Casserole

1/2 cup butter or margarine
3/4 cup of sugar
3 eggs, beaten
Dash of salt
1 can (#2) crushed pineapple
5 slices bread

Preheat oven to 325F.
Cream butter and sugar.
Add eggs and beat well
Add remaining ingredients.
Mixture will look curdled.
Place in 1 1/2 quart casserole
Bake at 325F for 40-45 minutes.

Notes:

Can be doubled for a 13" by 9" pan. Especially good with Hawaiian Sweet Bread, but white, wheat or hamburger/hot dog buns will do.
